



Average number of people newly diagnosed with HIV per day, selected years^a



NEWLY DIAGNOSED CASES

In September 2022, there were 1,347 confirmed HIV-positive individuals reported to the HIV/AIDS & ART Registry of the Philippines (HARP). This was a 37% increase compared to the same reporting period last year (981) [Figure 1]. Three hundred fifty-five (26%) had clinical manifestations of advanced HIV infection^{bc} at the time of testing [Table 1].

Majority (96%) of the total reported cases in September 2022 were male while 54 (4%) were female. The age of the reported cases ranged from 2 to 71 years old (median: 28 years). Further, among newly diagnosed cases, 3 (<1%) were less than 15 years old, 418 (31%) were 15-24 years old, 667 (50%) were 25-34 years old, 229 (17%) were 35-49, and 30 (2%) were 50 years old and older.

Moreover, there were 7 HIV-positive women reported pregnant at the time of diagnosis. The age of reported cases ranged from 15 to 38 years old (median: 25 years).



Sexual contact remained to be the predominant mode of transmission (1,323, 98%) while transmission through sharing of infected needles accounted for 5 cases (<1%), and 2 (<1%) were children who acquired HIV through mother-to-child transmission in this reporting period. Among the newly reported cases who acquired HIV through sexual contact, 941 (71%) males reported history of sex with another male, 260 (20%) sex with both males and femalesⁱ, while 122 (9%) through an opposite sex. More

than half (746, 55%) of the total cases reported were from the National Capital Region [NCR] and surrounding regions of CaLaBaRZon [4A] and Central Luzon [3] [Figure 2].




Anti-retroviral Therapy

In September 2022, there were 1,058^e people with HIV who were enrolled on treatment [Figure 3], 1,052 were on the first line regimen, four were on the second line regimen, and two were on other line of regimen. Among them, three (<1%) were less than 15 years old, 309 (29%) were 15-24 years old, 543 (51%) were 25-34 years old, 178 (17%) were 35-49 years old, and 25 (2%) were 50 years old and older. The median CD4 of these patients upon enrollment was at 205.5 cells/mm³.

A total of 65,197 people living with HIV (PLHIV) were presently on ART as of September 2022, of which, 62,799 (96%) were on the first line regimen, 1,940 (3%) were on the second line, and 458 (1%) were on the third line of regimen. Sixty-two thousand seven hundred fifty three (96%) were males and 2,313 (4%) were females. The age of reported cases ranged from 1 to 80 years old (median: 32 years old).



EPIDEMIC TRENDS OF HIV/AIDS IN THE PHILIPPINES, JAN 1984 – SEP 2022


Figure 4: Number of diagnosed HIV cases and advanced infections reported in the Philippines by year, Jan 1984–Sep 2022 (N=105,794)

Since the first reported HIV infection in the Philippines in 1984, there have been 105,794 confirmed HIV cases reported to the HARP [Figure 4]. Ninety-nine thousand seven hundred fifteen (94%) of those diagnosed were male^j and 6,068 (6%) were female^k. At the time of diagnosis, more than half (53,588, 51%) were 25–34 years old^k while 30,685 (29%) were among youth (15–24 years old^k). The age of diagnosed ranged from one month to 81 years old (median: 28 years). Thirty-two thousand one hundred thirty-three^l (30%) of the reported cases had advanced clinical manifestation at the time of testing [Figure 4]. There was a 28% increase in diagnosed cases in January to September 2022 (11,476) compared to the reported cases in the same period last year, January to September 2021 (8,943) [Figure 4].

Sex and Age


Ninety-two percent of the total reported cases (97,624 of 105,794) were reported in the past 10 years, thus showing a significant increase among reported cases when compared to the previous 10-year period (2002 - 2011). [Figure 5]. Specifically among cases reported among females, 4,639 (76%) of the total cases were reported in the past 10 years.

Among age groups, the highest increase in the proportion of cases from 2012 - 2022 were among 25 - 34 years old followed by those aged 15 - 24 years old. Consequently, more than 90% of the total reported cases among these age groups – 28,792 (94%) of total cases among 15 - 24 years old and 49,866 (93%) among 25 - 34 years old were reported in the past 10 years [Figure 6]. Meanwhile, among all female cases since 1984, 5,604 (92%) were in the reproductive age group (15–49 years old) at the time of diagnosis.

Geographic Distribution

From January 1984 to September 2022, the regions with the most number of reported cases were NCR, followed by CaLaBaRZON [4A], Central Luzon [3], Central Visayas [7], and Western Visayas [6], altogether accounting for 80,255 (76%) of the total reported cases. Further, 24,448 (23%) were from the rest of the country while 1,091 (1%) had no data on region of residence [Table 2].

Mode of Transmission (MOT)

As of September 2022, sexual contact among males who have sex with males (MSM) (86,614, 82%) was the predominant MOT among the total reported cases, followed by male-female sex (15,106, 14%), and sharing of infected needles (2,468, 2%). More than half of MSM (45,045, 52%) were 25-34 years old at the time of diagnosis, and 26,815 (31%) were 15-24 years old. Among diagnosed females, male-female sex was the most common MOT (5,653, 93%) followed by sharing of infected needles (146, 2%) [Table 3].

Among those who were reported to have acquired HIV through mother-to-child transmission, 262 were children less than 10 years old and nine were adolescents aged 10-19 years oldⁿ.

From 1984 to 2006, the predominant MOT was sexual contact between male and female, however, in 2007, the trend shifted to sexual contact among MSM and remained as such up to the present. Further, while the proportion of transmission through sharing of infected needles increased in 2010 with 147 (9%) of the total cases 1,552 reported among people who inject drugs (PWID), it has decreased to 1% among newly diagnosed cases in the past five years.

MOT varies across the Regions – 32,371 (38%) of diagnosed males who have sex with males were from NCR; more than half of those who have acquired HIV through mother-to-child transmission were from NCR, 4A,

and 3 (155, 57%); and almost all (2,461, >99%) reported cases among people who inject drugs were from Region 7.


SPECIFIC POPULATION

Youth (15-24 years old)

In September 2022, 418 (31%) cases were youth aged 15-24 years old, among which 404 (97%) were male. Four hundred-fifteen (99%) cases were infected through sexual contact (21 male-female sex, 334 male-male sex, 60 sex with both males & females^q), while three cases had no data on MOT.

From January 1984 to September 2022, 30,685 (29%) of the reported cases were 15-24 years old, of which, 20,106 (66%) were reported in the past five years. Twenty-nine thousand nine hundred twenty five (98%) were infected through sexual contact (3,110 male-female sex, 19,037 male-male sex, 7,778 sex with both males & females^q), 468 (2%) were infected through sharing of infected needles, one (<1%) was infected through mother-to-child transmission, and 291 (1%) had no data on MOT [Figure 7]. More males were diagnosed from the youth since 2004, however, the number of diagnosed HIV cases among female youth had increased in the past five years. Compared with the same reporting period (117) last year, there was a 42% increase in newly diagnosed females aged 15-24 years old from January to September 2022 (166).


Children (<10) & Adolescents (10-19)

In September 2022, there were 75 newly reported cases aged 19 and below, of which, 72 were adolescents aged 10 - 19 years old and three were children less than 10 years old. Among the adolescents, 17 (24%) were 15-17 years old, and 55 (76%) were 18-19 years old. All of the newly reported adolescents cases were infected through unprotected sexual contact (one male-female sex, 63 male-male sex, and 8 sex with both males & females^q). On the other hand, of the newly diagnosed children, two were acquired through mother-to-child transmission while one has no data on MOT.

Four thousand seven hundred forty five (4%) of all diagnosed cases from January 1984 to September 2022 were 19 years old or younger at the time of diagnosis, of which, 281 (6%) were less than 10 years old, 33 (1%) were 10-14 years old, 756 (17%) were 15-17 years old, and 3,675 (82%) were 18-19 years old [Figure 8].

Following the ratification of the Philippine HIV and AIDS Policy Act (RA 11166) where the age for HIV testing without the need for consent from parent or guardian was lowered to 15 years, the number of reported cases among 15-17 years old has increased by 47% from 2019-2022 compared to 306 total cases reported aged 15 - 17 years old before the ratification in 2018. Among newly reported cases from 2019 - 2022 (44,583), 450 (1%) were among those aged 15 - 17 years old and 1,594 (4%) were aged 18 - 19 years old.

Transgender Women (TGW)

Reporting of gender identity was included in the HARP starting year 2018. Of the total reported cases for September 2022, 799 (59%) were cisgender*, 44 (3%) were transgender women, eight (1%) identified their gender neither as man or a woman, one (<1%) was transgender man and 495 (37%) have unknown/no data on gender identity. Among the transgender women, 22 (50%) were 25–34 years old, 13 (30%) 15–24 years old, 8 (18%) were 35–49 years old, and one (2%) were 50 years old and older. The age of diagnosis ranged from 15 to 51 years old (median: 28).

A total of 1,468 TGW were diagnosed from January 2018 to September 2022. Almost all (1,454, 99%) of the cases transmitted through sexual contact was less than 1% (3) through sharing of infected needles. Eleven (1%) TGW had no data on MOT.

Further, half (730, 50%) of the TGW were 25–34 years old at the time of testing, 413 (28%) were 15–24 years old, 289 (20%) were 35–49 years old, and 36 (2%) were 50 years and older [Figure 9]. The age of diagnosis ranged from 15 to 63 years old (median: 28).

Transactional Sex

People who engage in transactional sex are those who reported that they either pay for sex, regularly accept payment for sex, or do both. Reporting of transactional sex was included in the HARP starting December 2012.

In September 2022, 144 (11%) of the newly diagnosed engaged in transactional sex within the past 12 months [Table 4]. One hundred forty-one (98%) were male. Their age ranged from 16 to 62 years old (median: 30). More than half (73, 52%) of the males reported paying for sex only, 44 (31%) reported accepting payment for sex only, and 24 (17%) engaged in both. Three females who engaged in transactional sex were diagnosed in this reporting period. All the reported females were accepting payment for sex.

A total of 11,356† cases reported to HARP from December 2012 to September 2022 were people who engaged in transactional sex. Eleven thousand-four (96%) were male. There were 6,046 (53%) who paid for sex, 3,591 (32%) who accepted payment for sex, and 1,719 (15%) who engaged in both [Table 4].

Overseas Filipino Workers (OFW)

Sixty-eight Filipinos who worked overseas within the past five years, whether on land or at sea, were newly reported in September 2022. They comprised 5% of the total cases for this period. Of these, 65 (96%) were male. Further, all of the reported male cases acquired HIV through sexual contact (9 male-female sex, 41 male-male sex, and 15 sex with both males and females[‡]). The age of male OFWs ranged from 20 to 69 years old (median: 32 years old). Four (6%) of the male cases were 15–24 years old, 35 (54%) were 25–34 years old, 22 (34%) were 35–49 years old, and four (6%) 50 years & older at the time of testing. Three (8%) female OFWs were infected through sexual contact. The age of the reported female OFW were 28, 33, and 34 years old.

From January 1984 to September 2022, 8,917 (8%) of the total cases were OFWs [Figure 10]. Of these, 7,839 (88%) were male. Seven thousand seven hundred sixteen (98%) male cases were infected through sexual contact (1,768 male-female sex, 3,588 male-male sex and 2,360 sex with both males and females[‡]). The ages of male OFWs ranged from 16 to 80 years old (median: 32).

Figure 9: Number of diagnosed TGW by age group, Jan 2018–Sep 2022 (n=1,468)




Among 1,078 (12%) female OFWs, 1,050 (97%) were infected through sexual contact. The age of female OFWs ranged from 20 to 73 years old (median: 35).

The regions with the most number of OFW reported to HARP were from NCR with 2,693 (30%) cases, 4A with 1,614 (18%) cases, and 3 with 1,124 (13%) cases. Further, 36% (3,221) cases were from other regions and 265 (3%) had no data on region of residence.

Pregnant Women with HIV


Reporting of pregnancy status at the time of diagnosis was included in HARP since 2011 and there was an observed increase in the number of diagnosed pregnant women in the past 10 years.

From January to September 2022, there were 86 HIV positive reported pregnant at the time of diagnosis. This was a 62% increase compared to the same reporting period last year (53). Of the reported pregnant women with HIV from January to September 2022, 31 (36%) were from NCR, 16 (19%) were reported from 4A, 10 (12%) were from 3, 8 (9%) were from 7, four (5%) cases were from Ilocos Region [1], and three cases each were from MiMaRoPa [4B], Bicol Region[5], CARAGA; two cases each were from SOCCSKSARGEN [12], CAR and 6; and one case each were from Davao region [11], and Eastern Visayas [8]. The age of diagnosis ranged from 15 to 41 years old (median: 25).

Since 2011, a total of 696 diagnosed women was reported pregnant at the time of diagnosis. The regions with highest number of diagnosed pregnant cases with HIV were NCR (295, 42%), 7 (113, 16%), 4A (96, 14%), 3 (70, 10%), and Region 11 (23, 3%).




Mortality

In September 2022, there were 270^{vw} reported deaths due to any cause among people with HIV, of which, 252 (93%) were males. One (<1%) was less than 15 years old, 39 (14%) were 15-24 years old, 124 (46%) were 25-34 years old, 86 (32%) were 35-49 years old and 19 (7%) (4) were 50 years and older [Figure 12]. One (<1%) death was reported with no age at the time of death. Forty (15%) of the newly reported deaths were from 4A. Region 4A, NCR and Region 3 comprised the top regions with the most number of deaths [Table 5].

A total of 6,183 deaths were reported from January 1984 to September 2022 and 5,194 (93%) were male. Among different age groups, the largest proportion of reported deaths were among the 25-34 years old accounting for 2,972 (48%) of total deaths reported [Figure 12] followed by 35-49 years old with 1,526 (25%), 15-24 years old with 1,335 (22%), 50 years old and older with 306 (5%), and <15 years old with 40 (1%). Meanwhile, the top 5 regions with the most number of reported deaths were NCR, 4A, 3, 6, and 7 [Table 5].

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HIV/AIDS & ART REGISTRY OF THE PHILIPPINES

The HARP is the official record of total number of diagnoses (laboratory-confirmed), ART outcome status and deaths among people with HIV in the Philippines. All individuals in the registry are confirmed by the San Lazaro Hospital STD/AIDS Surveillance Central Laboratory (SACCL) which is the HIV/AIDS National Reference Laboratory (NRL) and DOH Certified Rapid HIV Diagnostic Algorithm - HIV-1/2 Confirmatory Laboratories (CrCLs). Confirmed HIV positive individuals were reported to the DOH-Epidemiology Bureau (EB) and recorded to HARP. ART figures are counts of HIV positive adult and pediatric patients currently enrolled and accessing Antiretroviral (ARV) medication during the reporting period in 170 treatment hubs and primary HIV care treatment facilities that had reported in the HARP. This report did not include patients who have previously taken ARV but have died, left the country, have been lost to follow-up and/or opted not to take ARV. Lost to follow-up is considered once a person have failed to visit a treatment facility more than 3 months after the expected date of ARV refill.

HARP is a passive surveillance system. Except for HIV confirmation by the NRL & CrCLs, all other data submitted to the HARP are secondary and cannot be verified. Hence, HARP cannot determine if an individual's reported place of residence is where the person got infected, or where the person lived after being infected, or where the person is presently living. This limitation has major implications on data interpretation. Readers are advised to interpret the data with caution and consider other sources of information before arriving at conclusions.
